If you are a composer aged between 14 and 17 read on...

Every Year MRF selects up to 4 young composers to receive an award, along with a composition commission and composition support.

THE COMMISSION

We are very excited to have partnered with <u>Commotio</u>: Oxford-based choir and leading performer of contemporary choral music. Commotio will be our ensemble-in-residence 2025.

Each successful applicant to the scheme will be commissioned to write a short piece (maximum three minutes performance time), for SATB choir, to be premiered by Commotio in our Annual Festival, April 27th 2025, Alton, Hampshire. There will be a choice of short poems as texts to set, the focus of which will be Climate Change.

COMPOSITION SUPPORT

Composition-mentors:

Each award-holder will be introduced to a MRF mentor-composer. Their award will fund around 3 individual lessons in composition with that mentor through the Spring Term.

Workshops:

Award-holders will attend 2 workshops:

In late January there will be an *Introduction to SATB choir*, on writing for choir, with Commotio and their visiting conductor. This will be in Oxford on a weekday evening. Part-way into the composing stage, in February half-term, the Starting Points of the pieces will be workshopped with Commotio at a venue in Oxford, on a weekday evening.

Annual Festival:

Premiere performance Alton, Hampshire, April 27th a premiere performance will be given and a recording will be provided to the award-holder.

Included in the Annual Festival will be opportunities to sing with Commotio and / or to play new works by MRF alumni and / or other contemporary composers. The Festival will also host a reception as the public launch of the release of: *Martin Read – a celebration*, featuring Commotio, Joseph Spooner – cello, David Owen-Norris – piano, and other performers.

TO APPLY for an MRF AWARD, you need to be between ages 14 & 17 during this academic year...

You will be asked to consent to MRF holding your contact details. If you do, please continue with the form and write a short description telling us a bit about you, your aspirations and how you would hope to use any funds, your compositional experience so far and how you heard about MRF.





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You will then need to submit the following items:

- 2 contrasting compositions, each up to 3 minutes in length.
- A reference from your music teacher who is aware of your interest in composition.

Please send us your 2 best recent pieces, either complete pieces or substantial works in progress so we can get to know you as a composer. These do not necessarily need to be vocal or choral pieces, although if you've written any such pieces, you might like to submit one.

Application DEADLINE: 5pm Friday 27th December 2024.

Awards will be confirmed by MRF panel in early January '25. Selected young composers will be put in touch with a suitable mentor-composer and will receive a bursary to fund lessons in composition and certain travel costs to MRF events. The bursary is not to be used for accommodation.
